Program Format Overview

The SEALS 2019 Annual Meeting brochure reflects the contributions of committees, resource teams, and individuals in proposing panel topics, securing speakers, moderators, mentors, and writing panel descriptions.

The SEALS 2019 Annual Meeting program includes a variety of program formats. The paragraphs below provide a brief description of each format. Unless otherwise indicated, every program is open to all SEALS attendees.

New Scholars Workshop

The New Scholars Workshop offers newer faculty members an opportunity to present, and receive feedback on, a work in progress. Over the course of the annual meeting, there will be eight New Scholars Workshop sessions, each typically featuring a moderator and three or four speakers. Speakers are nominated by member schools, and each speaker is assigned a mentor, who is available to provide both pre-and post-presentation advice and commentary. Whenever possible, SEALS groups New Scholars Workshop panels thematically.

Prospective Law Teachers and Newer Law Teachers Workshops

In 2013, SEALS introduced two new features that built upon the success of its New Scholars Workshop. Given the features' success, SEALS is continuing them. The first is the Prospective Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the committee of the same name), which is aimed at assisting VAPs, Fellows, LLMs, and others interested in obtaining an entry-level academic position. This Workshop includes mock interviews, CV reviews, and various informational sessions to help attendees navigate the hiring market. The second is the Newer Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the Beginning and Newer Law Teachers Committee). These Workshops focus on issues that are of particular interest to newer law teachers, such as becoming a good classroom teacher, creating an effective course, methods of assessment, becoming a good scholar, and balancing service and scholarship.

Faculty Recruitment Initiative

This year, SEALS launched its Faculty Recruitment Initiative with iLaw. This Initiative is designed for entry-level applicants, laterals, visitors, and emertii. The objective is to lower the cost of faculty recruitment for both schools and applicants. The system takes advantage of modern technologies, and gives faculty the opportunity to upload lots of different types of information (e.g., video introductions, mock job talks, copies of scholarship, research agendas, etc.).

Topical Workshops

Each year, SEALS offers interrelated events under a Workshop designation. Topics vary from year to year. Each Workshop has several events, which usually are scheduled for a single day but sometimes extend into a second day. When possible, Workshop sessions are scheduled to follow the same break schedule as other programs, so that attendees with multiple interests can attend a topical Workshop session in one time slot and a different topical Workshop (or some other event) in another time slot in the same day.

Discussion Groups

Participants in these events will focus on a particular topic or theme, as identified in the program. Although Discussion Groups are convened in different ways, in many cases, the participants prepare a short paper in advance of the annual meeting that the other participants read and comment upon at the session. These sessions are often longer than a traditional panel session to allow for a more in-depth, interactive discussion of the topic or theme. Discussion Groups may, but need not be, linked to Workshop programs. Those who convene Discussion Groups are encouraged to include participants selected from a call for papers to

the SEALS membership. The program description for each session offers additional information about the composition of the event and the way in which the session will be conducted.

Panels

SEALS offers many "standalone" panels organized around a specific topic or theme. Topics and themes may be theoretical, doctrinal, pedagogical, service-oriented, law reform-oriented, or focused on other matters of interest to law school faculty members and administrators. Panels are moderated and typically consist of up to five featured speakers. In most cases, presenters are not required to submit or bring written drafts or copies of their related work.

Luncheons

The Call for Papers Luncheon, sponsored by iDesign, features the work of faculty members whose papers were selected from among those submitted for review. This luncheon is ticketed and requires advance reservations. Please consider attending the Call for Papers lunch to support the winning scholars, but be sure to purchase your ticket in advance.

The New Scholars Workshop Luncheon, sponsored by Wolters Kluwer, offers a networking opportunity for newer faculty members. Those participating in the New Scholars Workshop and the Prospective Law Teachers Workshop are invited to attend but must purchase a ticket in advance.

The Steering Committee Luncheon, sponsored by iLaw, is the meeting at which officers and committee chairs report on SEALS activities. It is also the forum at which institutional member schools elect new SEALS officers and other trustees. Each institutional and affiliate member school selects one individual to represent it at this luncheon (in addition to any faculty member who is already a trustee or committee chair).

The University of Kentucky College of Law, the University of West Virginia College of Law and the Elon University School of Law will sponsor a luncheon for all law school deans attending the conference.

West Academic is sponsoring a luncheon where attendees can learn about how CasebookPlus™ and West Academic Assessment help students test their understanding of core concepts as they're learning them in class with faculty-authored formative self-assessments.

Artificial intelligence (AI) performs tasks usually performed only by humans and uses large data sets to learn, create, and recognize patterns, and improve upon accuracy and efficiency every time AI is utilized. The Limits of Expressive Conduct Under the First Amendment

Recent controversies about religious and ideological objections to anti-discrimination laws, as well as other cases in which the First Amendment has been alleged to protect activities that are not literally speech, have raised the question of the appropriate scope of the Amendment's protection for speech, press, and religious exercise. Accordingly, this panel explores the scope of expressive conduct -- including constitutional protection against compelled expressive conduct. The panel will address which kinds of conduct should count as "speech" or the exercise of religion, in addition to the government's power to enforce generally applicable laws despite individuals' (or companies') objections that the laws interfere with their speech, association, or religious rights.

3:00 PM - Discussion Group: Classism in Academia Lawprofblawg, an anonymous blogger, has ra

Lawprofblawg, an anonymous blogger, has raised some compelling critiques about race, class and gender issues in academia. Specifically, he has called out the academy's top cited list as being classist, pointing out that few of the faculty on that list ever graduated from a law school lower than top 10. Few on the list are women, and few on the list are people of color. Moreover, many of those on the list currently work and write at a top 10 law school. These critiques have garnered a great deal of publicity of late, including a rebuttal on Prawfsblawg. Topics would include the following questions: Why are 94 percent of all Faculty members at top 10 schools graduated from top 10 schools? Why are nearly all of the 2017 top 10 law review authors from those schools as well? Why are only 30 percent of those academics at top 10 law schools women? Why don't we care about the most cited legal writing professors, clinical professors, or law librarians? Why can't they seem to get published in top 10 law reviews?

The feedback loop is central to effective teaching, but it can be a challenge in large classes. High student volume can create time and resource obstacles to professors with the best intentions. The short answer: simple solutions are best.

It has been 150 years since Charles Dickens put down his pen after a lifetime of writing about social injustices and the criminal justice system. His novels portrayed the abuse of vulnerable people – women, children, laborers, the poor – and their non-existent rights when faced with workhouses, slum housing, sexual exploitation, corrupt courts, brutal prisons, and capital punishment. Who are the vulnerable people in our criminal justice system and how are we failing them today? How are prosecutors, defense attorneys, and judges seeking to address those failings? How fragile are the rights of vulnerable people to protection from many forms of injustice? Criminal justice scholars share their insights about issues that touch on vulnerable people and fragile rights.

1:00 PM - Building Bridges: Socioeconomics, the LSAT and U.S. News and World Report 2:45 PM Rankings

This panel explores methodologies and programs that will help students from low income and diverse backgrounds have opportunities available to them to attend law school. AALS President Wendy Perdue of the University of Richmond has said: "As our society struggles with this problem of deep polarization, lawyers and law schools have an important role to play. Lawyers, are, after all, in the dispute resolution business. Resolving conflict is central to what we do. And today, perhaps more than ever before, the skills that we as lawyers have, and we as law professors teach, are of critical importance." In order to resolve these conflicts, we need to make sure that all communities have access to engage in these important conversations. The Before the J.D. Study shows that African American and Hispanic students think about going to law school before going to high school and college. In addition, the study highlights that over 60% of students report the most important advice about going to graduate or professional school comes from a family member or relative. Many students from low-income backgrounds do not have family members who are lawyers and are at a disadvantage in getting advice about going to law school because they may not be encouraged by these close family members or friends. There is still a small percentage of African American and Latino/a attorneys Nationwide 5% of lawyers are African American and 5% are of Hispanic origin. These percentages have remained consistent for almost the past ten years. So many students from these racial and ethnic backgrounds also can't readily turn to family members or friends for inspiration and advice about going to law school. The ABA reports that the entering class for 2017 has an aggregate African American enrollment of 8.6% and 13.2% for Hispanics. Meanwhile, African Americans consist of approximately 13% and Hispanics approximately 18% of the overall U.S. population. These two racial groups, along with Asian Americans, are on target to be a majority of the U.S. population in the next 30 years. Given the growth trends in these demographic groups, there will be an insufficient percent of lawyers from these groups to meet their (and society's) legal needs in the next few years. Moreover, some scholars have argued that there is a strong tie between socioeconomics and law schools admissions. There has recently been a very passionate Twitter discussion of this issue on Lawprofblawg. Some believe that the LSAT and U.S. News privileges those from middle- and upper middle-class backgrounds. Others point out the LSAT's strength in providing an accurate assessment of core skills required for success in law school and that an admission process that correctly uses the LSAT as one factor in a multi-factor holistic admission process is fairest to applicants. Recently, U.S. News attempted to reduce economic privilege in its rankings of undergraduate schools by injecting socio economic factors. The formula now includes indicators meant to measure "social mobility" and drops an acceptance rate measure that benefited schools that turned the most students away. A recent Politico article reported that U.S. News will change its methodology at the college level. This panel consists of experts who examine these issues in terms of the LSAT, U.S. News & World Report law school rankings, and socioeconomic and diversity issues.

8:00 AM - Discussion Group: The Socioeconomic Reliability of Communications Infrastructure Function During Times of Disaster

Access to communications is essential in disaster situations. In the communications realm, there was a historic commitment to ensure that land-based telephony had a great deal of planned redundancy so that it would continue to operate with a power outage. It is not perfect these days because the regulation and maintenance of utility poles is uneven and, accordingly, there may be communications outages as a result of inadequate tree trimming or maintenance of the pole itself. Communication companies are investing less in outside plants. As for wireless communications, it is virtually unregulated. Therefore there is no redundancy of the wireless cell sites or in the phones themselves. Accordingly, in disasters or power outages, many communications users who use wireless systems are unable to access service. This is becoming more of a problem as more people use only wireless telecommunications. The same issue arises for those who access the Internet through wireless technologies. With broadcast, radio, and cable communications, there has been much media concentration, which means that there is less locally produced programming. There are also many fewer reporters and employees in these sectors. This means that in some markets, when disaster hits it may be impossible for residents to get access to local information.

Recently, the European Union adopted a sweeping new directive, the General Data Protection Regulation, which mandates that companies take steps to protect online privacy. The GDPR gives regulators the power to impose large fines (up to 4% of revenue) on those who violate its provisions, and many believe that the GDPR will redefine the world's approach to privacy issues. This program examines the GRPR's requirements and potential impact (e.g., some U.S. websites now preclude those located in Europe from accessing their websites).

This discussion group explores limits on remedial discretion. Discretion is vital to both legal and equitable remedies from awarding punitive relief to issuing injunctions. Unbounded discretion raises significant concerns about proper judicial and jury role. Limits include institutional norms, legislation, procedural rules, constitutional strictures, precedent, appellate review, doctrines of restraint, and remedial hierarchies. The discussants offer suggestions for balancing remedial goals with principled, reasoned decisionmaking. Can a judge craft complete relief and avoid arbitrary calculations? If an injunction reaches nonparties, has the judge gone too far? This group tackles these questions across substantive areas including intellectual property, contracts, torts, unjust enrichment, criminal law, and constitutional law. Participants suggest ideal limits to shape the law of remedies to serve the rights at stake.

Programs such as TSA Pre, Nexus, and GOES employ advanced technologies to minimize the physical and bureaucratic obstacles that might hinder businesspeople and tourists who seek to cross international borders. Those same technologies, as well as the militarization of border spaces, patrols of border areas, violent interactions, and vehement anti-migrant rhetoric are all being used to deter or repel vulnerable migrants who are looking to exercise their rights under international refugee law to claim protection and status in the U.S. The result is two very different perspectives on borders, one connected to ideas of free trade and globalization, and the other to aggressive nationalist efforts aimed at creating ossified "new enclosures" that are designed to immobilize migrant and refugee populations. The latter trend is being met with resistance from lawyers and advocates who are initiating public awareness campaigns, launching court challenges, and fashioning novel approaches to blocking the new regulations. Participants have been invited to discuss on-going and novel legal efforts that aim to challenge the criminalization, classification, stigmatization, and biopolitical control of moving populations that this administration deems "undesirable," for whatever reason.

Legal academia faces a number of challenges that aren't easily resolved within the existing structure of legal education, and legal writing faculty are perfectly positioned to propose strategies to address these pressing issues. For example, many schools find it difficult to develop and implement assessment plans. Legal writing faculty can offer valuable insight into effective assessment measures because legal writing courses have traditionally been structured to incorporate formative and summative assessments. Similarly, legal writing courses prepare students to be practice-ready, so legal writing professors can provide useful tips on how to make students practice-ready. As leaders on the assessment and practice-ready frontier, legal writing professors should be recognized for their contributions, so this group also addresses professorial status for legal writing faculty.


